

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the ICD-10 for Non-Coders?

It is a four-hour course developed for non-coders who need to lead a successful PDPM transition and is intended for Administrators, DONs, and other management staff.

Do you have to be an AHCA member to register for the ICD-10 for Non-Coders Training?

No, both AHCA members and nonmembers are eligible to participate in the course.

How much does it cost to take the ICD-10 for Non-Coder training?

Registration fee: \$199 members, \$249 nonmembers. Payment and registration is completed by individual participant in the [AHIMA ICD-10 PDPM – Non-Coder](#) product in ahcancaLED.

How can an individual register and pay for ICD-10 for Non-Coder?

The individual who wants to take the course must login to ahcancaLED and register for the course under their individual login. Payment will be made in ahcancaLED upon registration via credit card or e-check. During the checkout process you will have the option to add more than one individual to your cart. This can only be done if all individuals have an ahcancaLED account.

How can an organization group register and pay for ICD-10 for Non-Coder?

One user can purchase multiple registrations for other users by adding them to their cart during the checkout process. The price of the training will be based on each registrant's member type (member or non-member).

Group purchase is available for groups of 26 or more. If you are interested in group purchasing, please email educate@ahca.org

AHCA offers the following discount structure for groups: 26-75 registrations will receive \$25 off each registration. 76- 150 or more registrations will receive \$50 off each registration. Group of 151+ please contact educate@ahca.org for negotiated price.

After full payment is made for group purchase of ICD-10 for Non-Coder, the designated individuals who the course registration payment was made for, will be provided with a unique group code for their group which will translate to \$0 due upon registration (because full payment has already been received). One code will be provided for each group with a max allowance of times that the code can be used based on the group's payment.

Each individual will need to login to the AHCA website to access ahcancaLED and then complete their own registration using the group code.

Can I get a refund if I no longer want to take the course?

No refunds are issued.

Can my registration be transferred to a colleague?

Registrations cannot be transferred. The individual that registers for the course is the only one that has access to it.

Where can I find the AHCA recommended pre-training?

AHCA's recommends a slow deliberate pace as trainees move through both the coder and non-coder versions. To aid with placing the ICD-10 content on perspective, we recommend watching the following pre-recorded webinars:

What are the requirements to successfully complete ICD-10 for Non-Coder?

Participate in each module and successfully complete the final assessment (achieve at least 70% correct)

The final assessment may be attempted three times before the participant is required to repeat the module and then reattempt answering questions.

Complete course evaluation at the end of the course.

How long does it take on average to complete the ICD-10 for Non-Coders course?

The learning time of all modules, review of additional resources, time to complete the modules and final course evaluation and final test accounts for 4 hours.

Participants are encouraged to spread out the course over time in an organized manner – such as scheduling module reviews on various dates/times when they can focus their attention to it. The course could be completed within a week or over several months based on how the individual would like to approach the program.

Are Contact Hours awarded for ICD-10 for Non-Coders?

Yes, 4 CNEs for nurses or 4 AHIMA CEUs for Health Information Management (HIM) professionals and 4.50 NAB approved CEs

What does a participant get when they complete the ICD-10 for Non-Coders?

Participants receive two certificates at the completion of ICD-10 for Non-Coders:

- AHIMA CEU certificate for Health Information Management professionals
- CNE Certificate for Nurses
- NAB approved CEs

How long does the certificate last?

Certificate of completion does not expire.

How can someone renew their certificate?

The certificate of completion does not require renewal.

Is ICD-10 for Non-Coders a certification?

No, ICD-10 for Non-Coders is a specialized training program with a certificate upon successful completion.
